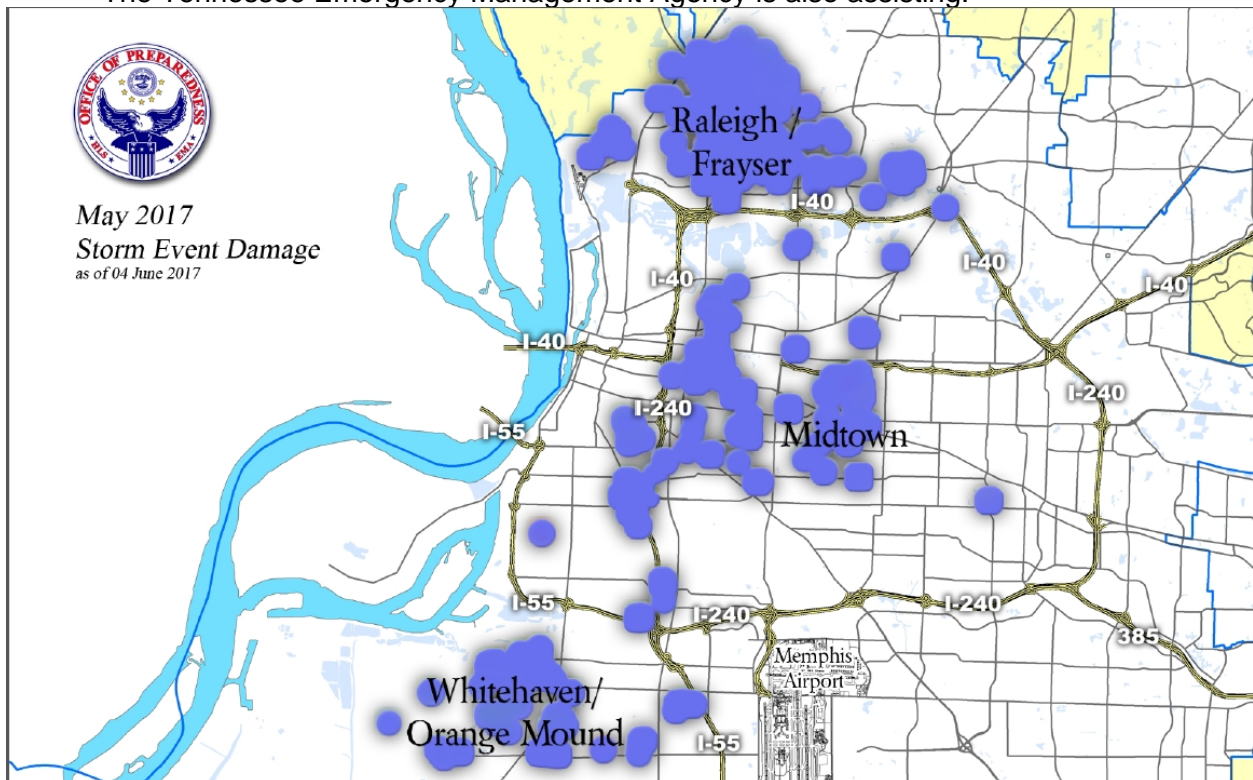

Storm Damage Update

- The Shelby County Office of Preparedness continues to coordinate the storm response effort with the Memphis Office of Emergency Management.
- The Tennessee Emergency Management Agency is also assisting.



What's new since the last update?

MLGW

- 1,800 MLGW customers are without power. Outages: 1-800-268-8648.
- MLGW crews are being assisted by more than 100 utility companies to help restore power.

Disaster Assessments

- See attached storm damage map.
- The Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA) continued the joint Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) in the City of Memphis and Shelby County for federal Public Assistance.

- The categories of Public Assistance include work or repairs for debris removal, emergency protective measures, roads and bridges, water control facilities, buildings and equipment, utilities, and recreational facilities.
- Just whether there will be FEMA Individual Assistance funds is not yet known.
- Damage assessments are still being done on homes and businesses.
- Those results will be forwarded to TEMA once they're completed.

Roadside Debris Removal

- Both Memphis Public Works and Shelby County Public works crews are hauling away tree debris that blocked roads.
- Lots of trees were pushed to the curbsides to allow vehicles to pass.
- Debris removal will take several weeks.
