Hazardous Driving Conditions Continue Tonight In Shelby County

Law enforcement officers and public works crews say ice remains on roads, especially near Shelby Forest, Woodstock and other parts of north Shelby County.

Ice, downed tree limbs and power lines continue to affect several intersections tonight:

- Hwy 14 at Tracy-reports of black Ice from Mudville to the Shelby County line
- Brunswick at Godwin
- Most roads in the Northaven area have iced over
- Hwy 51-only one lane is open
- Austin Peay bridges over the Loosahatchie are iced over
- Secondary and side roads from Paul Barrett, north and west from Stewart Road are iced over
- Locke at Benjestown
- Hines at Cuba-Millington
- Garnett at Independence
- 6900 block of Benjestown
- Fite at Walsh

Light snow should taper off tonight. However, any melted snow could refreeze on streets making driving hazardous for the morning rush-hour.

The low tonight will be in the teens. Citizens should check on relatives and friends who live alone, especially the elderly and disabled. Pets should also stay indoors.
