Possible Snow Tonight With Very Cold Temperatures on the Way

Forecasters say snow will likely move into the Shelby County area tonight. That, with a low temperature near 20 degrees, could lead to travel problems for the morning commute.

“Although road conditions greatly improved in the area today, citizens need to be on the alert. The ground is already cold so snow will probably stick. That will make driving hazardous,” said Dale Lane, Director of the Shelby County Office of Preparedness.

The high temperature tomorrow will linger near freezing. Brisk winds will make it feel much colder. Then tomorrow night, the low is expected to drop below 10 degrees.

“Those are dangerously cold conditions. We’ll be continually in touch with social services agencies such as the Union Mission for the next several days,” added Director Lane.

Road conditions continued to improve throughout the area today. Shelby County Government used two road graders to push away slush before it could re-freeze.

“Director Lane and his staff at the Shelby County Office of Preparedness are staying in contact with all the emergency services coordinators throughout Shelby County. People should continue to keep a close watch on those who live alone, especially the elderly and disabled,” said Shelby County Mayor Mark H. Luttrell, Jr.
