

# GOAL #2 : DECREASE MISEAMEANOR WEAPONS

## Goals for 2017

- Decrease and address the number of youth detained with weapon charges.

## Results for 2017

- Juvenile Court's Ceasefire Gun Program which is an alternative to detention was implemented March 2016.
- Since the inception of the program, it has been responsible for diverting 297 youth from detention.
- The program has a 19% recidivism rate.

- **The Results:** Decrease in admissions with Domestic Assault charge.




# Juvenile Justice Summit



- **2<sup>nd</sup> Annual JDAI Juvenile Justice Summit**
  - Over 250 in attendance
  - Judge Michael discussed the importance of collaborative relationship in the community.
  - Speaker, Kevin Bethel addressed the importance of training local law enforcement to help reduce the number of juveniles that may come in contact with the Juvenile Justice System.
  - As a result, we had an increase in subcommittee and mentorship participation.
- **The goal of the 2017 Juvenile Justice summit was to provide a discussion platform to help decrease the number of youth entering the Juvenile Justice System.**



# JDAI PARENT FORUMS OF 2017




Using Parent Forums as an opportunity to engage on a personal level with the community, JDAI hosted two Parent Forums to have an open discussion on issues from the citizens point of view.

\*Juveniles who were in detention for part of a day were rounded to the nearest category.




# Memphis Police Department Training
